Alexander, Lloyd. The Book of Three

Recounts valorous and humorous tales of Taran, Assistant pig Keeper, who determines to save the kingdom of Prydain from evil.

Almond, David. Skellig

Unhappy about his sister's illness and the chaos of moving into a new house, Michael retreats to the garage where he finds a mysterious stranger who is something like a bird and something like an angel.

Banks, Lynne Reid. I, Houdini

A boastful hamster with an exceptional talent as an escape artist recounts his experiences chewing, wriggling, or squeezing his way out of tight places in his quest for the great Outside.

Clement-Davies, David. Fire Bringer

The young deer buck Rannoch is born with an oak-leaf shaped mark on his head that means he will be the savior of his herd. Now he must make a dangerous journey to meet that destiny head-on.

Cooper, Susan. The Dark is Rising

On his eleventh birthday, Will Stanton discovers that he is the last of the Old Ones, destined to seek the six magical signs that will enable the Old Ones to triumph over the evil forces of the Dark.

Creech, Sharon. The Wanderer

13 year old Sophie and her cousin Cody record their trans-Atlantic crossing aboard the Wanderer, a forty five foot sailboat, which along with uncles and another cousin, is en route to visit her grandfather in England.

Curtis, Christopher Paul. The Watsons Go to Birmingham--1963

The ordinary interactions and everyday activities of the Watsons, an African American family living in Flint, Michigan, are drastically changed after they visit Grandma in Alabama during the summer of 1963.

Hesse, Karen. Stowaway

A fictionalized journal relates the experiences of a young stowaway from 1768 to 1771 aboard the ship Endeavor which sailed around the world under Captain James Cook.

Lowry, Lois. Gathering Blue

Lame and suddenly orphaned, Kira is mysteriously moved from her squalid village to live in the palatial Council Edifice, where she is expected to use her gifts as a weaver to do the bidding of the all-powerful Guardians.

Lowry, Lois. Number the Stars

In 1943, during the German occupation of Denmark, 10 year old Annemarie learns how to be brave and courageous when she helps shelter her Jewish friend from the Nazis.

Nix, Garth. Sabriel

Sabriel, daughter of the necromancer Abhorsen, must journey into the mysterious and magical Old Kingdom to rescue her father from the Land of the Dead.

Paterson, Katherine. Sign of the Chrysanthemum

Centuries ago, a teen comes to know himself through contacts with social ills and political unrest while searching for his father in Japan's capital.

Paulsen, Gary. Dogsong

A fourteen-year-old Inuit boy who feels assailed by the modernity of his life takes a 1400-mile journey by dog sled across ice, tundra and mountains, seeking the "song" of himself.
